This song is played in two chords separated by a semitone. To play along with the original use F# G6C6E6A9 and G G7C7E7A9 but the song can be transposed to any two chord combination to suit voice or preferred playing position. In first position, D G2C2E2A0 and Eb G0C3E3A1 or A G2C1E0A0 and Bb G3C2E1A1 work well. Alternatively drop the F# formation to any position and slide up one fret for the next chord...or do the same with any other formation that covers all the strings – to get the two chords.
